WHY STUDY AT SFX?

WHY STUDY AT A 6TH FORM COLLEGE?

In total there are 62 sixth form colleges across England. Unlike colleges who accept students of all ages, sixth form colleges only teach 16-19 year olds. At a sixth form college you can benefit from:

- **Expert teachers** – teaching staff who are only teaching the 16-19 age group.
- **Specialised support** – the support teams within sixth form colleges are specialised to the needs of 16-19 year olds, from UCAS application support provided by the careers department, to safeguarding teams regularly trained on issues faced by young adults.
- **Wider course choice** and a greater combination of options.
- **Preparation for university** – the level of student independence and responsibility is increased at sixth form colleges in comparison to at school. This means students are better prepared for the independent study and self-motivation required at university.

WHY SFX?

Much more than a 6th form – We offer the SFX Oxbridge & Russell Group Programme for students aspiring to go to the top universities, first class careers guidance, and a broad range of enrichment activities.

Experts in 16-19 education – the vast majority of our teachers are only teaching their specialist A level or BTEC subject and are therefore experts in their subject and at teaching the 16-19 age group.

Over 40 courses – A wide range of A level, Level 3 and Level 2 Diploma courses with excellent pass rates.

Excellent facilities – Which aim to meet all of your needs. Over £10 million has been invested in facilities in recent years. This includes two Learning Resource Centres; a professional fitness suite; a Starbucks Coffee shop and canteen and the refurbished music studio - all on one secure site.

Catholic ethos – The College has a unique Catholic ethos with core values: kindness, service, faith, inclusion, courage, honesty, respect and forgiveness.

Equality, diversity and inclusion – we have received the Investors in Diversity Award, determined by the way we manage equality, diversity and inclusion through a planned and whole approach.

FACILITIES

SFX can offer you the very best in learning and recreational facilities. Our Learning Resources Centres, computer suites, science labs, drama, media and music studios and gym are furnished with all the equipment to help you succeed and have fun while you're here.

LEARNING RESOURCES CENTRE (LRC)

The Learning Resources Centre (LRC) includes a regularly updated paper-based and digital library and excellent IT and study facilities. There are individual study desks as well as a Group Study area for students to use outside of their lesson times. There are over 70 computer workstations and additional iPads that can be borrowed for student use in the LRC. The library contains over 30,000 books, audio-books and e-books, DVDs and Kindles, as well as a wide variety of magazines. The LRC is open for student study before lessons begin in the morning through to the end of the day, with late study hours twice a week.

VIRTUAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT (VLE)

The College has built up a substantial Virtual Learning Environment (SFX Moodle) which offers additional learning and assessment resources, closely targeted to your programme of study. It is also the route by which work may be submitted to tutors. Within this platform there are blog and wiki tools which allow students and teachers to exchange ideas or debate subject topics.

THE FITNESS SUITE

SFX's Fitness Suite is the ideal environment to achieve your personal fitness goals. With state of the art equipment and passionate support staff on hand to offer training and nutritional advice. The Fitness Suite boasts a wide range of equipment including treadmills, rowing machines, weight machines and free weights. All students are welcome to use the gym for free following an induction.



CATERING FACILITIES

We have a large canteen, serviced by the largest independent caterer in the UK. You will find:

STUDENT COUNCIL

The President and Vice President of the Student Council are elected by the students to represent their needs and interests and to contribute to the decision-making and governance of the College. Members of the Student Council serve on the governing body. The students are expected to initiate and take responsibility for many of their own activities, including social activities such as the student Prom, and their contribution to the wider community through collections for charity or other awareness raising events.

THE ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

Our expert teachers and staff work very hard to ensure that when you come to SFX you gain a well-rounded experience both inside and outside of the classroom. We organise activities to complement your main programme of study along with those which give you the chance to enjoy and interact with other students beyond class or tutor group. These include sports teams, debating societies, poetry and reading groups, gardening club and the charity committee.

COURSE ENHANCEMENT

Within your chosen courses of study there are opportunities to hear from visiting speakers and to participate in educational visits both in the UK and abroad. In 2018 students travelled to New York for the largest Model United Nations conference in the world, as well as visiting universities to take part in competitions and taster days and museums and exhibitions.

Our Careers Department organise internal events such as the Higher Education fair and workshops with universities to aid with applications for study following college.

SPORT

In 2017 SFX received a £98,000 grant from Sport England to put towards getting students active and developing our sports offering. This has been invested in new equipment including trampolines; activity-based trips including "Go Ape" and towards the development of our sports teams. The football and basketball clubs have an outstanding record, regularly winning league awards and the girls' football and netball teams are thriving. The PE Department is keen to accommodate anyone who wishes to participate in the sports offered and will offer support to those who wish to broaden the 6th Form's repertoire of individual or team sports. SFX has a Fitness Suite, equipped to industry standard and fully supervised, giving students the opportunity to develop personal fitness under the guidance of a fitness professional.

A CATHOLIC SIXTH FORM COLLEGE

We at St Francis Xavier 6th Form College aim to provide for the educational needs of our students in a Catholic environment that proclaims Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life. We are committed to a community based on mutual respect where we recognise our responsibilities to ourselves and others.

THE CHAPEL

SFX has a beautiful Chapel situated in Xavier Wing which has been a place of prayer and worship for over 120 years. The Chapel affords an opportunity for students and staff of any faith or none to find some time for peace and reflection. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the Chapel which, for Catholics, designates this a particularly sacred space. Daily prayer is held in the chapel each morning and Eucharistic service/mass takes place every Friday lunch time. All students and staff are welcome to attend or take part. Additional ecumenical services take place at key times in the academic and liturgical calendar.

PRAYER ROOM

The College has a designated gender-segregated Prayer Room where prayer mats and beads are available for staff and students to use. Like the Chapel, the SFX prayer room affords any member of the 6th Form community a quiet space in which to reflect and pray.

CHAPLAINCY DEPARTMENT

The Chaplaincy is an integral part of College life at SFX. Our full time Lay Chaplain provides our community with various opportunities to explore and deepen spiritual beliefs through voluntary prayer services, times of reflection,

opportunities for charity work and retreats. The Chaplain also manages The Base - a social space open to every member of the SFX community. The Base provides a safe space in which students can meet together, play games, discuss and debate issues that affect them. Working alongside the College pastoral team, our Chaplain also helps to support individuals coping with the stresses of daily life and those faced with particular challenges such as bereavement, ill health and loss.

EQUALITY & DIVERSITY

Our Christian mission demands that we recognise the dignity and equality of every individual. We are proud of our diversity and support one another in resisting and challenging prejudice and discrimination.

We have worked closely with the National Centre for Diversity to achieve the 'Investors in Diversity' Award. As such there is an Equality & Diversity group comprising staff and students promoting the aims and objectives inherent in our mission. Each of our subject areas are required to identify how they contribute to our equality and diversity objectives in their lessons and every opportunity is taken to ensure that equality and diversity themes are included in our comprehensive tutorial programme and faculty gatherings.

CORE RELIGION & PHILOSOPHY

It is a requirement that all students participate in Core Religion & Philosophy for one lesson each week. This programme allows students to debate moral and spiritual matters. The programme considers a wide range of issues including relationships, justice, science and religion, along with an examination of the different faith traditions. Students also have the opportunity to reflect upon, question and debate matters of a personal and social importance. Students complete a workbook throughout their course to receive a NOCN qualification in Theology and Religious Studies.

STUDENT SUPPORT

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Bursaries/Free College Meals:

Bursaries/free college meals will be available in 2019 – 2020. These are subject to Government funding and are assessed on an income basis.

Fees: There are no tuition fees chargeable to full-time students from within the European Union for those under 19 years of age on 1st September 2019. However, there is a payment of £50 from each new student, collected on enrolment, which supports the provision of enhanced ICT facilities.

ADDITIONAL LEARNING SUPPORT

If you have either a disability including a sensory impairment or a learning difficulty, please be assured that you will receive tailor-made support from trained specialists who receive continuous updates in their training. Support is available in the following ways:

- In-class individual support
- Workshops
- Special exam arrangements

COLLEGE COUNSELLOR*

The College Counsellor offers a professional, confidential service to all students to help them deal with difficult feelings. You can self-refer or ask your tutor to refer you. The counsellor will offer you an initial appointment to discuss the issues affecting you and to decide with you whether or not counselling can help you. Counselling is not compulsory, so you can stop at any time.

*The Counsellor works on a part-time basis, and provision of counselling is subject to demand for the service not outstripping staff availability.

STUDENT WELFARE*

We at SFX understand that your general wellbeing is central to your academic success. Whenever you need help or advice, there is someone to turn to. We offer a confidential, dedicated service to help manage your studies and deal with any issues, questions or concerns you might have, whether they are personal, financial or practical. Some of the issues we help with include the following:

- Looked after children and care leaver advice and support
- Semi/Independent living
- Homelessness
- Finance and funding
- Welfare benefits and counselling
- Health (physical and mental)

*The provision of this service is subject to the availability of the Student Welfare Officer. Named staff are available in the event of safeguarding issues.

PASTORAL SUPPORT

Every student will be allocated a tutor group and your tutor will be your biggest support in the years you spend at SFX. Each tutor group belongs to a House, headed by a member of staff who is there to offer further support and guidance. SFX is proud of its pastoral care and support and our dedicated team will be on call to help when it is needed.

STUDENT SAFETY

The safety and welfare of all our students is of paramount importance here at SFX. The Designated Safeguarding Officer and Safeguarding team are trained to detect and manage any issues that may arise. All members of SFX staff and governors receive safeguarding training on a regular basis. SFX staff cooperate and engage with external agencies wherever necessary in accordance with legislation. Our safeguarding policies are comprehensive and available to view on our website. Through our tutorial programme we discuss safeguarding issues with all our students to ensure that they are aware of how to keep themselves safe. This includes areas such as online safety and health. SFX staff continuously updates policies and tutorials in the light of emerging issues.

CAREERS GUIDANCE

At SFX, the Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) Programme is central to each student's programme of study and progression throughout their college education. The CEIAG Programme is integrated into the Tutorial Programme for our students and is designed to match students' academic progression and enhance their career plans for the future.

The CEIAG Programme activities include:

- Structured careers lessons for all students
- Booked individual careers interviews (also open to parents)
- In-house and externally organised events
- Careers workshops
- Job search and interview skills training

Students are encouraged to participate in university course taster sessions, summer schools and to go on university visits. The Careers Department builds partnerships with employers, training companies and universities to increase progression opportunities for our students.

HIGHER EDUCATION & CAREERS FAIR

This very successful event held each year in March is an opportunity for our students to meet and interact with university staff, employers and training providers. At this event, students discuss university courses, apprenticeships and other training and employment opportunities with representatives from over 40 universities and employers.

OXBRIDGE, RUSSELL GROUP & PROSPECTIVE HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

The Russell Group programme is open to students who have achieved outstanding GCSEs and are hoping to progress to highly-selective universities. On this programme you are expected to:

- Study at least two facilitating subjects*
- Attend additional stretch and challenge classes
- Complete the Extended Project Qualification (see page 35) to develop your critical, reflective and problem solving skills and to support your application to university

* Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, English Literature, Geography, History, French and Spanish.

This programme will develop your thinking and debating skills and provide you with an insight into the university admissions process. You will also have access to academic lectures and seminars, placements on university master classes and summer schools, practice interviews and visits to

universities. We regularly organise debates with Members of Parliament and local councillors and have hosted talks from a variety of university professors.

Talks and visits have included:

- Oxford and Cambridge Universities
- Study trip to Paris
- Conference at LSE
- Study workshops at the British Museum
- Visiting talk from Mayor of London Sadiq Khan
- Visiting talk from Chuka Umunna - MP for Streatham
- Visiting talk from Baroness Grender - Liberal Democrat Life Peer
- Black History and Cultural Activities
- Education workshops at the Welcome Collection

PROSPECTIVE HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

Medical, dentistry and veterinary degrees are some of the most challenging and competitive degree courses. At SFX we have a dedicated medic, dentist and vet nurture group which supports students in applying to these courses by assisting them in securing dedicated work experience placements, visiting lecture sessions in universities and running workshops and practice interviews.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & GUARDIANS

At SFX students have all the support they require to help them reach their potential. We guide and help them to cope with their studies through our successful pastoral system and with access to specialised support via our counselling and welfare support services. We keep you informed of their progress by means of our Progress Review evenings, and our Careers Department are always on hand if you have any questions about their plans once they have graduated from SFX.

PASTORAL SUPPORT

SFX is proud of its pastoral care and support system with a dedicated team on call to help when it is needed. Each student is part of a tutor group and will find that their personal tutor is their biggest support during their time at SFX.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY PROCEDURES

Our teachers lead by example by being punctual and prepared for lessons and ensuring that every lesson is a valuable experience with effective starter activities that are worth being punctual for. Teachers record attendance and punctuality accurately on the day of the lesson and follow up poor attendance and persistent lateness, involving parents and guardians when issues with attendance or lateness arise.

MONITORING & ENCOURAGING STUDENT PROGRESS

Tutors will work with both the student and you, their parent/guardian, to maintain achievement and to overcome any difficulties which may arise during their studies by:

- Building a positive ethos around learning, attendance, punctuality and behaviour
- Supporting students who are having difficulty with learning, behaviour, attendance and punctuality through discussion and advice
- Inviting you, the parent/guardian, to attend Progress Review evenings twice a year with your son/daughter to meet with their subject teachers and tutor to hear about how they are doing in their studies.
- Providing each student with an Individual Learning Plan (ILP); an on-going process of assessment, feedback, target-setting and review to support them in continually improving their performance in their courses
- Sending full reports to parents/guardians at the end of each ILP period.

YEAR 12 HIGHER EDUCATION PARENT/CARER EVENING

The Careers Department organise this event aimed at all parents/carers of first year students which offers you the opportunity to meet university staff from several universities in our London partnership. You will also be able to gain an insight into opportunities on offer in UK higher education institutions, and how to best prepare young people to take full advantage of their academic and career opportunities.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Bursaries/free college meals will be available in 2019 – 2020. However, these are subject to Government funding and are assessed on an income basis.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

FOREIGN QUALIFICATIONS

If you are successful in gaining a conditional offer and have foreign qualifications (excluding iGCSEs), you will need to provide a NARIC Statement of Comparability, which gives an official comparison of your qualifications to UK qualifications (such as GCSEs). Go to www.naric.org.uk to make an individual application. We will not be able to enrol you unless we have this information.

FEES

There are no tuition fees chargeable to full-time students from within the European Union for those under 19 years of age on 1st September 2019. However, there is a payment of £50 from each new student, collected on enrolment, which supports the provision of enhanced ICT facilities.

RESIDENCY

If you are not a British citizen, a citizen of the European Union (EU) or a citizen of the European Economic Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland), you will need to prove your residency status and entitlement to free 16-19 education. This means that during enrolment we must see the original of your passport and immigration status documents from the Home Office.

At SFX we pride ourselves on the inclusive nature of the College and value the diverse backgrounds of our students. Your student journey will be enhanced by the numerous enrichment opportunities on offer and a network of friends will help you develop academically, socially and culturally. At SFX we value the development of all aspects of the student experience and you will enjoy a cross-cultural learning environment that will help you achieve the best academically providing a strong foundation for the years ahead, either in university or the world of work.

HOW TO APPLY

International students must apply using the online application form at www.sfx.ac.uk/apply. When entering your qualifications please select the most similar options at GCSE and, if invited to an interview, bring along details of the course(s) you are taking and your predicted grades. Please see page 17 for more information on how to apply.

SUPPORT

If English is an additional language you may receive tailored support in one or more of the following ways; individual, small group or in-class. You may also have the opportunity to sit the Cambridge PET or IELTS examinations, an additional qualification in English.

FLUENT SPEAKERS

Students fluent in French, Spanish, Portuguese or Italian may be eligible to take the language as an additional A level. Fluent speakers of other languages who can prove their competence can be entered for A level examinations.

COURSE TYPES

A LEVELS

- 2-year full-time course
- Students typically take 3 A level subjects (considered for 4 A levels if GCSE results meet entry requirements)
- Entry requirements: 6 GCSEs grade 4 or above, preferably including Maths & English Language. (See back pages for course-specific entry)
- Final grades based mainly exams completed at the end of the 2 years.
- Chosen A level subjects do not have to be related, but certain combinations will complement each other
- Some university courses will ask for specific A level subjects.
- The majority of students following an A level programme progress to university. A small minority of students seek employment on completion of their course.

BTEC/ UAL LEVEL 3 EXTENDED DIPLOMA

- 2-year full-time course
- Students typically take one extended diploma subject
- An extended diploma course is equal to 3 A levels in terms of UCAS points; a triple distinction/ DDD is equal to AAA at A level/ when converted to UCAS points
- Entry requirements: 5 GCSE at 4 or above/ BTEC Level 2 Diploma Merit (See back pages for course specific entry)
- Final grades are based on coursework or set-tasks completed throughout the two-year period. There may also be an externally marked exam in some of the extended diploma subjects, which will account for a small percentage of the overall grade.
- BTEC courses will often include a work placement as part of the course
- The majority of students progress to university to study their subject at degree level. Some students seek employment on completion of the qualification. These courses develop a wide range of skills and aptitudes which are valued by employers.

BTEC LEVEL 2 DIPLOMAS

- 1-year full-time course
- Entry requirements: 4 GCSEs at 3 or above/ pass in Foundation Learning
- Equivalent to 3/4 GCSEs
- Can be taken alongside English and/or Maths GCSE retakes
- Final grade based on coursework and set-tasks completed throughout the year course and some externally assessed exams.
- Can progress to Level 3 if an overall merit or above is achieved

ENGLISH & MATHS GCSEs

GCSEs are taught over one year and are offered as an addition to your main course of study.

All students who have yet to achieve a grade 4 in Maths and/or English Language are expected to take the relevant GCSE(s) at SFX.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

- 1-year full-time course
- Entry requirements: interest in subject areas and willingness to work hard
- Equivalent to 4 GCSEs grades D-G
- Progress will be continually assessed throughout the academic year using a credits system. On completion of the course the overall outcome will be pass or fail only.
- Can progress to Level 2 once successfully completed



COURSE DESCRIPTION

Explore the world of art and design, experiment and learn through the creative visual process. We support learners to become highly independent, creative and self-motivated individuals. You can expect to work with a broad range of media, including traditional techniques such as drawing, painting and printmaking, and new media technologies, including digital photography and film. In year one, the focus will be exploring ideas, developing skills through the creative process, learning from creative exploration to become visually literate and articulate. As well as developing mastery of practical skills, creative and visual learning; Fine Art A level fosters creative problem solving, independence, innovation and risk taking as well as engagement with historical and contemporary cultural, social and political issues. You will have the opportunity visually to explore, challenge and develop your own ideas and opinion on significant themes and issues. You will also make contextual links between your own work and that of other artists and designers. We visit a range of exhibitions and workshops throughout the course.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is at the end of the second year and is comprised of internal marking and external moderation. The External Assignment is set early in the Spring Term of the second year.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

Students who wish to specialise in Art & Design typically progress on to a Foundation Diploma in Art & Design at UAL institutions or Ravensbourne College of Design. Students wishing to progress to architecture may make direct applications to degree courses from this A level. Progression to university from A level Fine Art is high. Career opportunities include architecture, interior design, product design, illustration, textile design, set/theatre design, fashion design, vehicle design and many others.



The **Beliefs and Ideas** unit looks at the philosophy and ethics of love and relationships. Those who like a good argument will be able to consider Greek and Roman ideas related to the passions, frustrations and delights of love in the ancient world. The ethical questions raised by these ideas continue to be wrestled over and students will be able to discuss important issues surrounding love, desire, sex, sexuality and the institution of marriage.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is 100% examination based.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Classical Civilisation complements English Literature, History, Politics, Performance Studies, Religion and Philosophy and Art.

Through **The World of the Hero**, students will study some of the greatest pieces of literature produced in the Ancient World; the Odyssey and the Aeneid. Both texts will be explored for attitudes and values of the time and what it was like to be a hero in the Classical world.

The **Greek Theatre** unit allows students to explore the background to western theatre performance, using art and architecture, and to engage with ancient Greek comedy and tragedy, both of which pose questions relevant to society today.

I was looking for a college which provided autonomy to discover yourself but also structure to keep you accountable. My sister had previously studied here and always spoke greatly of her experience.


WHAT IS YOUR CURRENT JOB?

I currently convene a global community of WWF (World Wide Fund for Nature) staff, driving national action on the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). With over 100 WWF staff from 51 countries, I facilitate collective action and learning on advocacy, private sector engagement and coalition building on the SDGs.

I have in-depth experience building youth networks in Africa and UK. In 2015, I was a UK representative of the Action 2015 network, where I organised a series of public campaigns to raise awareness of the SDGs in the UK. I co-organised the Youth Summit on the Sustainable Development Agenda in September 2015 with the UK Department for International Development. I led a citizen-led national campaign, #30days30voices, featuring blogs submitted by young people.

ADVICE TO YR11 STUDENTS:

Choose learning over knowledge. Formal education is important and will open doors for you but they do not determine your life and how successful you are. People who are constantly curious and are always learning are the ones who become who they truly want to be.



COMPUTER SCIENCE



HIGHLIGHTS

- 1 Ability to solve problems by programming.
- 2 Half of the top jobs in US (and soon here in the UK) need an ability in coding.

A LEVEL (AQA)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

To succeed in A level Computer Science, students have to learn a high level programming language. Training and support is given but potential students should be aware that programming skills only come with considerable practice inside and outside the classroom. Interest in problem solving is paramount. The computing curriculum is focused around developing your initial programming knowledge. In your second year, you are required to design and develop a business or learning application using industry standard software such as VB.net and SQL Server.

The course contains a wide range of topics including:

- Hardware - the inner workings of computer systems (e.g. CPU, data and address buses);
- Software - data processing (e.g. databases), data structures (e.g. graphs, trees, lists, stacks and queues);
- Logic - binary gates and finite state diagrams;
- Computers in Society - the consequences of electronic systems including legislation

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Two exams in year two. One theory; the other including practical programming. The practical programming project makes up 20% of A level marks.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

This subject is useful if you want to go on to study Computing, Computer Science or Computer Engineering at degree level. For these subjects, A level Computer Science should be supported by an A level in Mathematics. You could also pursue career options such as software development and media production.

PLEASE NOTE: It is not necessary to take A level Computer Science in order to study Computing at university. A level Maths is sufficient, however, the learning curve is much steeper if you do not. We highly recommend taking A level Mathematics alongside this course.

WHAT OUR STUDENTS SAY

The coding aspect of the course is really intense, but enjoyable. I realised that to do computing one has to be dedicated and spend time on debugging code. Having done so, I feel more confident as a programmer.

COURSE UNITS

YEAR 1

Unit 1: Changing awareness of crime

Unit 2: Criminological theories

YEAR 2

Unit 3: Crime scene to courtroom

Unit 4: Crime and Punishment

COURSE DESCRIPTION

How do we decide what behaviour is criminal? How do we explain why people commit crime? What makes someone a serial killer, or abusive to their own families?

Knowing about the different types of crime and the criminological approaches to theory will give you a sharper insight into the kind of thinking used by experts and politicians to explain crime and criminality. Public law makers are informed by theory and apply these theories to their own solutions to the problem of crime.

Level 3 Applied Diploma in Criminology is a qualification with elements of psychology, law and sociology that complements studies in other humanity subjects. Learning is related to authentic criminal case studies.

Criminology is taken alongside two A level subjects.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The course is 50% coursework (internal controlled assessment) and 50% exam (external 90-minute exam). 50% of grades are achieved in year 1 and 50% in year 2.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

An understanding of criminology is relevant to many job roles within the criminal justice sector, social and probation work and sociology and psychology.

DRAMA & THEATRE



WHAT OUR STUDENTS SAY

A LEVEL (EDEXCEL)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

A level Drama & Theatre will involve taking part in practical work to explore a range of different plays, demonstrating your understanding of performance texts and studying the work and methodologies of two influential theatre practitioners. As part of this course you will go to see live theatre and work alongside theatre practitioners.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

On this two year course you will take part in three externally assessed performances.

Component 1: DEVISING (40%) – Your creation and performance of original piece of theatre, working as a member of a cast. Submission of written coursework about the devising and performance of your production in the form of a portfolio.

Component 2: TEXT IN PERFORMANCE (20%) – Your performance of a monologue and a group performance of an extract from a play you have studied on the course.

Component 3: THEATRE MAKERS IN PRACTICE (40%) This written exam is made up of three sections:

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1 Numerous theatre trips such as the Young Vic & West End productions. Recent trips include: 'The Lion King', 'Custody', 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', 'Galileo', 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time' and 'The Woman in Black'.
- 2 Perform in plays with professional production values in our specialist theatre space.
- 3 The opportunity to work on theatre reviews with professional theatre critics.

Section A: Live Theatre Evaluation - Analysis and evaluation of a play you have seen in production.

Section B: Page to Stage: Realising a Performance Text - How you would stage a script in performance.

Section C: Interpreting a Performance Text – Presentation of your own Director's Concept of a play for a contemporary audience.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

Many A level Drama & Theatre students go on to university where they take a range of degree courses including Law, Criminology and English. Students also progress to drama schools such as RADA and careers in the professional theatre.

COURSE UNITS

Theme 1: Introduction to Markets and Market Failure

Theme 2: The UK Economy- Performance and Policies

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students on this course will examine how markets and businesses operate in the real world. They will explore how government policies and world events influence the economy and will look at the role of emerging economies in the global economic system.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1 London School of Economics mentoring
- 2 One to one tutoring by top undergraduate and postgraduate students
- 3 Lectures at Economics institutions such as Institution of Economics Affairs and Bank of England
- 4 Bank of England trip

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The course will be assessed with 3 exams at the end of year 2. Each exam requires some numerical skill as well as the ability to articulate your ideas and judgements clearly in written form.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

This subject is useful if you want to go on to study Economics or another related degree at university. Common career paths for Economics graduates include Banking and Accountancy. It is also suitable for those considering careers in most business areas, as well as law. Many students in the department go on to study Economics at a higher level.





EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)



HIGHLIGHTS

- 1 Trips to the British Library.
- 2 Students often receive lower offers at competitive universities if they achieve an A grade in EPQ.

AS LEVEL (AQA)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The EPQ is offered in addition to a 3 A Level or a level 3 BTEC programme. It may be carried out individually or as a group and can be practical or essay based. The course provides students with the opportunity to select a topic that they are particularly interested in and conduct both primary and secondary research. EPQ will develop and improve students' own learning and performance as a critical, reflective and independent learner. The course also helps develop skills such as planning, research, critical thinking, analysis, synthesis and evaluation.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Students select a topic of their choice, design and carry out research and reflect on the project process. They are required to complete an essay (between 1,000-5,000 words), logbook and presentation for formal assessment.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

The EPQ is a highly valued and respected course which is designed to enhance the student's ability to work independently through the development and utilisation of a series of academic skills, all of which are beneficial to future study and employment.

PLEASE NOTE: The EPQ is particularly beneficial for those applying to Oxbridge and other highly competitive universities.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Geography is exciting and relevant and is the subject for our times. You will be given the opportunity to develop an in-depth understanding of physical and human geography, the relationship between people and the environment, and to become critical, reflective and independent learners. A key part of the course involves residential fieldwork to a coastal area in southern England.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

80% of the marks are for three exams of 2 hours 15 minutes each.

20% of the marks are for an Independent Investigation of 3000-4000 words. (The four days of field work feeds into this coursework.)

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

Geography is included amongst the key facilitating subjects in a guide compiled by the Russell Group of 20 leading universities. Jobs related directly to geography include cartography, surveying, environmental consultant, GIS officer and teaching. The transferability of geographic knowledge and skills make it one of the most sought after qualifications for many other careers such as international aid, logistics and distribution, finance, tourism and transport.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

You will read, research independently, question, discuss and argue in small groups in class reacting intelligently and critically. You will need to enjoy forming arguments and carefully select evidence to support them. We will help individuals to develop clear, concise and accurate powers of expression, orally and on paper. Activities will include essays, source work, debate and research. History students go on a number of trips including the Tower or London, Hampton Court and university visits.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

A level History is 80% exam and 20% coursework.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

History is a well-respected A level, which many students continue to study at degree level. It is useful for any career – particularly those which involve research, analysing information and developing arguments. Students often progress to careers in politics, the Civil Service, banking and management consultancy, journalism, teaching, law, public relations and advertising.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The topics studied in year one of the course include: a range of social issues and trends such as the changes to family life in Spain, education and the impact of tourism in Spain. You will also study aspects of the political and artistic culture. Topics include different festivals and traditions, music and media. In the second year of the course you will learn about immigration and you will also cover 'The Two Spains: 1936 onwards'.

You will study a set film and book which will be assessed through a target language essay and there will be an independent research project assessed within the Speaking exam.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

MATHEMATICS



A LEVEL (EDEXCEL)

Maths is a highly respected A level that goes well with Science, Economics and Computing, but is also good for anyone who enjoys Maths and wants to do it to a higher level. It is a lot of work, so only choose it if you know you are good at it and enjoy problem solving.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1** We enter students each year for the UK Senior Maths Challenge. The top four then represent SFX at the UK Team Challenge.
- 2** Visiting speakers from university maths departments and the Operational Research Society.
- 3** Trips to popular Maths lectures at the London Mathematical Society and other places.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Two thirds of the Maths A level course is Pure maths, one sixth is Statistics and one sixth is Mechanics.

Pure Maths: Includes quadratics, straight lines, calculus, trigonometry and logarithms.

Statistics: Builds on the averages, correlation and probability distributions you have done at GCSE. You will be using computers to work with a very large data set.

Mechanics: How movement is affected by forces.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is 100% examination based. There will be three exams. You are allowed a calculator in all exams.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

For many of us Mathematics extends into our chosen profession: civil servants need to analyse data; economists need to recognise financial trends; engineers need to take account of stress patterns in physical materials. This subject is useful if you want to go on to study maths, engineering, computing, economics or a science at degree level. It can also be beneficial for research based subjects, such as psychology or subjects such as business. There are many careers that you can go into after studying maths.

FURTHER MATHEMATICS



A LEVEL (EDEXCEL)

If you love Maths and are really good at it, you should consider Further Maths. You will be taught in a small class of very able mathematicians. It is a great option for students for whom Maths is their favourite subject.

Must be taken alongside Mathematics. Can be taken as a fourth A level.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Half of the course will be extra Pure Maths, one quarter will be Decision Maths and one quarter will be extra Statistics.

Pure Maths: Includes vectors, complex numbers and matrices.

Decision: Using networks and graphs to solve maximising or minimising problems.

Statistics: Hypothesis testing and goodness of fit tests.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is 100% examination based. There will be three exams.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

It is highly recommended if you are considering studying a degree in Maths, Physics, Engineering, Computing or Economics at one of the best universities.

HIGHLIGHTS

A LEVEL (EDUQAS)

Our programme of study is creative, critical and compelling in its approach, offering a unique combination of theory and practical work. Your study of Media will help you develop your appreciation of moving image and print media's rich artistic, social and political traditions.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students will learn about the following areas of study through close analysis of carefully chosen media texts, a thorough application of theoretical perspectives and a major coursework project.

Media Language: How the media communicates meanings for audiences through media texts such as advertisements, television programmes and newspaper reports.

Media Representation: How the media portrays events, issues, places, individuals and social groups through the processes of selection, construction and mediation of media texts.

Media Industries: The processes of production, distribution and circulation by media industries and how these affect media forms and platforms.

Media Audiences: How media institutions and their texts target, reach and address audiences, how audiences interpret and respond to them and how members of audiences become producers themselves.

Production Skills: Students are required to individually produce a major coursework project. Students will devise a digital video media product, developing valuable practical skills in moving image production and post-production processes using industry-standard software available on our Apple Mac platform.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

70% exam based, requiring excellent literacy skills as well as extensive reading around the subject. 30% coursework production; creative flair and a vivid imagination is vital for the successful completion of all coursework elements.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

A Level Media Studies offers excellent preparation for any one of the range of Media or Film Studies courses available in higher education, with many of our students taking up offers from Royal Holloway University of London, University of Hertfordshire, Goldsmith's University and Warwick University.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course aims to provide students with a balanced education in politics. Subject areas covered in the first year include democracy, political parties and the role of Parliament, with a focus on the UK system. In the second year students study political ideologies including liberalism, socialism and conservatism and movements such as feminism. Students will also study global politics, looking at issues such as terrorism and international peace keeping. This is an ideal course for anyone interested in current affairs and political ideas.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is 100% examination based at the end of year 13.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

This subject is useful for anyone wanting to study Law, Politics, Philosophy, History, Journalism (or any other subject) at university. Students with Politics A level often progress to careers in Law, management, journalism or politics.

COURSE UNITS

Unit 01: Social influence, Memory, Attachment and Psychopathology

Unit 02: Approaches in Psychology, Biopsychology and Research Methods

Unit 03: Issues and debates in Psychology, three optional topics (Gender, Schizophrenia & Forensic Psychology)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Psychology is the scientific study of human behaviour and experiences, where we look to explain why people are the way they are. The course aims to extend our everyday observations of human behaviour by attempting to explore the truth behind what is 'known' scientifically. Psychology also examines how to help treat individuals who suffer from various psychological disorders, and the different ways one can go about this. Most of Psychology is literature based, however, there are sizable science and mathematical elements.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The A level course is 100% examination based through three papers. All papers include multiple choice, short answer and extended writing questions.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

This subject is very useful if you want to go on to study Psychology, Counselling, Youth Work, International Relations, Politics, Business or other Social Sciences at degree level. You can study either a BSc (Science) or a BA (Art) in Psychology, so individual university requirements need to be checked as they may vary. A Psychology degree has been widely regarded as one of the most versatile degrees when trying to access the job market after university, since humanity and human elements are present in all parts of life.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Religious Studies covers some of life's most fundamental questions: Does God exist? If God is 'loving and powerful' then why does s/he allow suffering? What are the sources of authority in Religion? Do heaven and hell exist? How do developments in society impact on religion? Is religion sexist? How should I live? How should we live as a society? How can we ensure good ethical practice alongside new advances in medical developments? You will examine these kinds of issues in a critical and analytical way, regardless of whether you are a person of religious faith or not.

Universities and employers place great value on Religious Studies because it helps students to develop key skills such as the ability to develop and structure coherent arguments, provide textual analysis and very importantly it fosters independent thinking.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment is 100% examination based. There will be three exams at the end of the course.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

Take subjects that you genuinely enjoy, otherwise you may end up having a miserable time at sixth form that could culminate in failure!




SCIENCE AT A LEVEL

Choose science subjects if you want to extend this curiosity in science, engineering or technology. We recommend you study at least two science subjects at A level. Study science to develop the skills and knowledge essential for shaping the world of tomorrow.

At SFX we teach science through practical work so in addition to frequently carrying out experiments you will also apply your mathematical communication skills to the full. Science at A level provides exciting and new challenges to all students.

PHYSICS



HIGHLIGHTS

- 1 In 2017 students visited the Large Hadron Collider, near Geneva, Switzerland. Not only is this the International number one laboratory for Physics but it is also where the Internet was born.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO

It is strongly recommended to study Physics with A level Mathematics as this is essential for most physical science or engineering based degree courses. A level Physics is a very good indicator of a student's academic ability and is therefore highly regarded by most universities, including law and accountancy. In particular, Physics is essential for those wishing to study a Science, Engineering, Mathematics, Architecture or Medicine at degree level.



Students will analyse three main areas; notational analysis, team analysis, and individual player analysis to produce mini presentations on their findings.

Students can complete an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which is worth an additional half an A-Level and can significantly



support their university application as well as their own sporting development (see page 35 for more information on EPQ).

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The course is assessed via coursework including written assignments, presentations, consultations, practical assessments, video evidence and creative work such as posters or models produced.

THIS COURSE CAN LEAD TO


